Clinical Pharmacist

It is important that all of our patients on regular medication receive at least an annual review to ensure that the medication is still appropriate. Notification that your review is due is either on your repeat prescription or via letter or telephone call from the surgery, close to your birthday. Failure to attend a review may mean that the Dr is unable to issue any further medication until you are seen.

Student Doctors

Oundle Surgery is a designated training practice for student doctors from the University of Cambridge. Student doctors have not completed their initial medical training so are not qualified doctors, but work under close supervision of the GP's here at Oundle. If you are happy to see a student this is very much appreciated as you will be making a significant contribution towards their training and the students do find this time invaluable and rewarding.

Flu

Consent to share information

We recognise that a lot of our patients receive assistance from family and friends and often this may include help with making and attending appointments, unfortunately unless we have consent from our patient we are unable to give out any details regarding any aspect of their medical care including details of appointments.

If you wish to grant consent for someone else to act on your behalf we do have a consent to share information document that can be completed and placed on your medical file, this enables the named persons(s) to make and cancel appointments and receive test results on your behalf (you are able to stipulate the level of detail that you wish to consent to share).
